- Coordinated work to meet new EPA and ODEQ regulations.
- For the DWSRF alone, Oklahoma cities and towns will need \$5.4 billion in new infrastructure over the next 20 years. Cities and towns need to work together for REAP grants, CDBG, the Revolving Loan Fund and Rural Development to let our legislators know that these programs are essential for infrastructure and economic development in Oklahoma communities.
- Assuring through cooperation with ODEQ that proposed fee increases are substantiated and fair and equitable.
- Developing a workable program for ODEQ rulemaking to implement water reuse and other efficiencies for water management in Oklahoma.
- Educational workshops and networking opportunities.
